Superintendent's Goals for FY2009

Please note: The four categories of goals below originated from the School Committee's Long Range Strategic Planning efforts and are identified as the district's Strategic Goal Areas.

Curriculum, instruction, and assessment that maximizes each student's learning and achievement:

- The work of the Technology Task Force will be acknowledged and incorporated, as appropriate, into the Superintendent's recommended FY10 budget.
- The initiative to close the achievement gap will result in a set of additional recommendations that will continue to be discussed and examined by the administration and instructional staff. Previous recommendations will be acknowledged and either acted upon or discarded. (This is a very complex and challenging problem, and we will not have a full solution in hand by June 2009.)
- The initiative to explore the introduction of Chinese as a foreign language will produce recommendations that will be further considered during the FY10 school year.
- The health and wellness initiative will be further coordinated and incorporated, as appropriate, into the Superintendent's recommended FY10 budget. Where possible, external funding for this initiative will also be pursued.
- The ongoing work of the full-day kindergarten study group will be acknowledged and incorporated into the FY10 budget, if appropriate.
- Public presentations by members of the instructional staff will be scheduled throughout the year for the purpose of allowing the Committee and others to better understand the instructional goals of the different grades and academic disciplines.

A diverse, knowledgeable, and skilled community of educators and leaders:

Staff development opportunities will be arranged throughout the year that emphasizes technology
training for staff, administrative training in teacher recruitment and evaluation, and the differentiated
instruction of students (with an emphasis on opportunities for those who may be academically
advanced).

Family and community partnerships to support the learning and growth of each student:

- The district's efforts to properly inform the community of teen drug and alcohol abuse and prevent the same will be promoted and expanded via a coalition of concerned citizens and community organizations.
- Efforts to generate additional funds for school-supported initiatives will be pursued via user fees, grants, the solicitation of donations and advertising (if acceptable to the School Committee.)
- The district will produce a district report card (via our webpage) that promotes the reputation of the district by factually portraying the students' academic accomplishments and involvement in athletics and extra curricular activities. Related staff information will also accompany this public document.

Strategic management operations, resources, and facilities to enable and empower the educational community:

- The greening initiative will continue and result in documented efforts to control and curtail material and energy consumption. Recycling efforts will be promoted to raise awareness among students and staff.
- The work of the High School Building Committee will be fully supported.
- A proposed operational budget for FY10 will be developed and publicly presented to the School Committee. Supporting data and rationale will accompany the Superintendent's recommended budget.
