Katie passed away from health complications on April 24, 2001. The Katie Lynch Foundation seeks to fund programs, which create opportunities and foster respect for individuals with disabilities, including Boston's Children's Hospital's

Opening Doors for Youth and Understanding Our Differences. There is a charity runner component to the race in which runners can run to raise funds for the Foundation.
