News from the High School Building Committee

It isn't news that there are significant facility deficiencies at Wayland High School that will not go away. Deteriorating buildings, falling concrete, lack of handicap accessibility, EPA violations, inadequate lighting and electrical systems, too small classrooms, overcrowding, outdated science labs - our accreditation is at risk if these problems are not addressed.

But progress has been made in recent months. After a four-year suspension in the state aid program, the Mass. School Building Authority is operating again with funds to award. Last year, Wayland was approved to proceed with a Feasibility Study and Schematic Design, one of only 19 districts that far along. Working through the new MSBA process, we now have an architect and owner's project manager on board, as well as a target enrollment for design. The Futures team is on track to update the educational strategy and specification for a modernized and expanded high school this month. The MSBA has confirmed that Wayland can expect 40% reimbursement for this project.

Now, the town must authorize additional funding to proceed with the MSBA and obtain state aid. According to the MSBA's formula, this next phase is budgeted at \$1,026,000. \$300,000 has already been authorized, leaving an additional \$726,000. However the net cost to Wayland won't exceed \$315,600, because the MSBA will reimburse the rest (40% of the \$1,026,000).

These funds are in the capital budget that must pass this April for the project to move forward. Mark your calendars now for Town Meeting, beginning April 13. For more information, visit www.waylandschoolcommittee.org/whs/hsbc/index.htm.
