### AT A GLANCE: A Few Things that your Donations help Supports

- \$13,500 for teachers and staff for classroom materials and supplies
- \$1,400 per grade to bring in guest speakers such as Abigail Adams, Ben Franklin and representatives from Plimoth Plantation. This money is also used to supplement bus costs associated with field trips.
- \$4,100 for cultural enrichment programs such as Chinese Acrobats and musical groups.
